The MATHCOUNTS Foundation is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that reaches students in grades 6-8 in all U.S. states and territories with fun extracurricular math programs. More than 160,000 students participate in MATHCOUNTS each year. MATHCOUNTS runs 3 programs—the MATHCOUNTS Competition Series, National Math Club and Math Video Challenge—and also creates numerous free math resources, available at www.mathcounts.org.

Collaboration opportunities include:

Coordinators running more than 500 chapter and state competitions in February/March need volunteers to help with scoring and on-site logistics or serve as guest speakers and awards presenters. These local MATHCOUNTS competitions take place in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam and in schools worldwide affiliated with the Dept. of Defense and Dept. of State. The National Math Club is completely free and open to any type of group, so SAME members can start a math club in their area or work with a school-based club. MATHCOUNTS provides dozens of online activities, mailed game materials, an app and a suggested calendar for the year to make planning club meetings easy. Club activities are fun for students at any level of skill development in math. Learn more at www.mathcounts.org/club.

The Math Video Challenge is completely free and open to any students in grades 6-8, so SAME members can advise local students or work with a school-based team. MATHCOUNTS also needs volunteers to score video submissions to select finalists in April. In this project-based contest, students work in teams of 4 to create a video that shows a solution to a MATHCOUNTS problem in a real-world setting. Learn more at www.mathcounts.org/mvc.
