KEY POINTS

- The need to plan for the maintenance of infrastructure, considering the increase in facilities
- Safety - there were 2 fatalities last year due to pre-existing medical conditions. All businesses should review their own safety programs, find out if their workers have limitations and be prepared to respond. Crane safety should also be focused on, as there will be an increase in crane work.
- More than \$20million was spent on environmental issues last year
- A new amendment for the Explosive Safety Submission (ESS) is being developed, and estimated to be completed by summer 2018
- BOS contract Transition is moving forward and should conclude in April 2018
