Louisiana Post Scholarship Program Summary

Louis J. Schober Memorial Scholarship:

- \$2,000 one-time award
- Open to undergraduates in appropriate fields of study at a Louisiana college/university plus sons and daughters of active Louisiana Post members regardless of school of enrollment.
- Selection factors include:
 - Scholastic record
 - Enrollment in a school/college of engineering
 - Demonstration of leadership characteristics
 - Former or current military service
 - Participation in school and community activities
- Selection made by Scholarship Committee

Louisiana Post SAME Scholarship:

- \$2,000 one-time award
- Open to students enrolled at Tulane, LSU or UNO and members of SAME.
- Selection factors include:
 - SAME member
 - Scholastic record
 - Enrollment in a school/college of engineering
 - Demonstration of leadership characteristics
 - Former or current military service
 - Participation in school and community activities
- University Faculty makes nominations.
- Selection made by Scholarship Committee.

Time Table:

- February - college scholarship/ROTC offices contacted to update POC list
- March - applications mailed to college/ROTC POC's
- May - application deadline
- May - applications reviewed by committee
- June - recommendations presented to Post officers and directors
- June - winners and other applicants notified
- September - scholarships presented

Outstanding Achievement Award

- \$150 award, up to three per year (Navy, Air Force, Army)
- Open to R.O.T.C. students enrolled in an engineering curriculum
- Selection factors include:
 - Scholastic record
 - Enrollment in a school/college of engineering
 - Demonstration of leadership characteristics
 - Participation in school and community activities
- Selection made by R.O.T.C. staff at each University.
- Award made in April
