“July 10, 2021 Thunderstorm – Staffing the Cleanup”

The thunderstorm that rolled through the Omaha metro on July 10, 2021 was one of the most damaging windstorms on record. The winds speeds were equivalent of an EF1 tornado but the core of the storm was 25 miles wide. The storm reached its peak intensity on the eastern side of Douglas County within densely treed and populated neighborhoods. In all the storm caused 188,000 power outages in OPPD’s territory, the most ever. Crews from all over came to restore the power but staffing and housing those crews took a coordinated effort. This presentation shares those coordinated efforts and how they were able to undertake the ambitious effort to restore power.
