Response & Recovery Planning

Mitigation, response and recovery planning is an ongoing effort. These CEND event scenarios have been identified for planning in Omaha and Douglas County:

1. Chemical Release / HAZMAT Transportation Incident
2. Flood / Ice Jam
3. Snow / Ice Storm
4. Tornado / Severe Wind
5. Explosion / Large Fire
6. Structural Collapse / Building and Special Event Evacuation
7. Interruption of Utilities / Energy Supplies or Essential Commodities
8. Non-HAZMAT Ground Transportation Incident such as Passenger Train, Bus with Occupants or Large number of vehicles
9. Aircraft Incident at Airport
10. Aircraft Incident in the Community



11. Active Shooter(s)
12. Mass Illness
13. Nuclear Release
14. Biological Agent Release
15. Earth Movement such as Dam Failure, Land Slide or Earthquake
16. Civil Unrest
17. Evacuation of Citizens
18. Reception of Evacuees
19. Contamination of Natural Surface Waters
20. Agricultural or Food Chain Contamination, Disease or Infestation
21. Cyber Disruption
22. Disruption of Local Government Operations

SCENARIO-BASED PLANNING

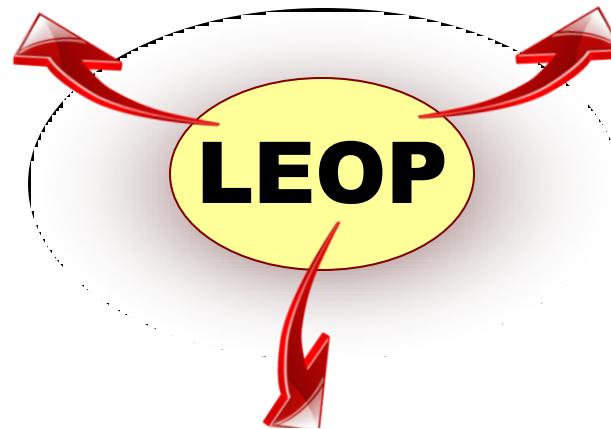
What possible scenarios might we encounter and what are the appropriate courses of action for managing each?

(e.g. Tornado, Mass Illness)

FUNCTION-BASED PLANNING

How and by whom will emergency functions be performed?

(e.g. Mass Care, Evacuation)



CAPABILITY-BASED PLANNING

What is the right mix of training, organizations, people, plans, leadership, equipment, facilities, etc. to perform a certain required emergency task?

(e.g. Mass Dispensing, Medical Surge)

Levels of Acceptance of Outside Plans

On occasion, local EMA is requested by an outside entity to render an opinion or disposition on a written plan or document for which the outside entity is the owner and / or author. If local EMA agrees to do so, it may render one of the opinions defined below.

Acknowledge Receipt. This means that local EMA has received the document but renders no opinion as to the document's adequacy, accuracy or completeness.

Reviewed and Recommend Changes. This means that local EMA has read the document in whole or in part and has provided written recommended changes for an improved document. Local EMA may or may not, rely upon or utilize the document in whole or in part, if the recommended changes are incorporated.

Approved. This means that local EMA approves of the use of selected parts of, or the entire plan by another entity. It also means that local EMA will rely on an outside entity to be the custodian of the document and that the custodian and the other agreeing stakeholders identified within the plan will use and adhere to the applicable parts of the document should the need arise.

Adopted. This means that the document in whole or in part, will be co-owned and used by local EMA who will also assist in updating the document as needed.
