What is the Society?

The Society of American Military Engineers (SAME) is a non-profit, professional engineer organization, which has over 21,000 individual members and more than 2,800 corporate affiliates throughout the world. SAME has over 100 local posts (chapters) in major cities and at military installations in the United States and abroad, plus student chapters at leading engineering colleges and universities. The Society strives to bring public and private sector engineers together, so they can be employed in the nation's domestic and international interests. SAME is headquartered in Alexandria, VA.

Why was It Organized?

During World War I, active military engineers served with thousands of civilian engineers who were taken in the military services. Those experiences convinced the Army Chief of Engineers the nation urgently needed a permanent organization to cultivate the relationship among these engineers in peacetime, leading to the founding of the Society in 1920. The soundness of this concept has been amply demonstrated by the service of SAME members to the nation when threatened by war or peacetime disasters. The Society serves as a vital link between military and civilian engineers, supports continuing education and promotes professionalism.

What Are SAME's Objectives?

- To promote sound relationships among engineers and related professionals in both private and public sectors.
- To develop a spirit of cooperation and mutual understanding among engineers of the uniformed services.
- To advance the knowledge of federal engineering and assure the latest advancements in engineering technology are understood, practiced and shared with industry, as appropriate.
- To promote efficiency in and among the uniformed services and promote their best standards and traditions.
- To preserve the memory of the services rendered by the engineering profession during contingency operations conducted and wars fought by the United States.
